## **Herman Teppo and Maria Amanda Kangas Teppo Genealogy Notes**

### **Herman Teppo Genealogy Notes**

- 1896 – Institute of Migration lists a Herman Teppo who emigrated to New York from Hanko 2 May 1896. No birthdate was listed, just “adult male.” This is likely our Herman Teppo, age 17 in 1896. Passport record for Herman Andersson Teppo, 27 Apr 1896, born in 1879, home parish Lapua.
- 1900 Federal Census, Gogedic Co, Wakefield Twp. lists Herman Teppo, age 20, living with parents Anton and Amelia Teppo, occupation miner, born in Finland, emigrated in 1896.
- By June 1900, the Herman Teppo family had their own household in Wakefield Township, Gogebic County, Michigan. But they didn’t stay there long. Their children’s birth record shows they were in MT in 1902, back in Michigan in 1903–5 or so, in AZ in 1907 and back again to Wakefield in early 1909. In 1910, Anton’s remaining family in Wakefield was now in a building with 28 other boarders and the only child left in the household was the youngest, Henry. Anton Sr. died about 1915 and, in 1920, Amalia and Henry lived in Wakefield in a smaller house (no boarders). A Nels Teppo, his wife (Hulda) and son were living next door so almost surely they were related. Anton Nels Teppo registered for the World War I draft in 1917 and was a hotel manager at a Finnish Cooperative Merchantile in Wakefield at the time. He showed Hulda Teppo as the nearest living relative.
- 1910 Federal Census, Michigan, Gogebic, Wakefield , Herman, age 30, married 10 years to Amanda, occupation listed as iron miner, Celia, born in Montana, George, Jennie, Charles.
- 1915 – Family homestead was in Tripp, Wi, near Iron River. The Teppo family moved to Tripp in June 1915 from Wakefield, Mich.
- 1918 WWI Draft Registration for Herman Teppo, Iron River, Bayfield Co., Wisc.; born Aug 15, 1879, farmer, wife: Amanda M. Teppo of Iron river, Wisc, signed Sept. 12, 1918
- 1920 Census, Wisc, Bayfield Co, Tripp Township, Herman, b. abt. 1880 in Finland, age 40, emigrated in 1896, naturalized in 1900, occup. farmer; wife Amanda, b. abt 1880 in Finland, age 41, emigrated in 1895, naturalized in 1898; Celia M. b. 1900 Montana, public school teacher; George T. b. 1902 Mich, farm helper; Jennie E. b. 1906 AZ; Carlo H. b. 1908 Mich; Venner A. b. 1911 Mich; Henry E. b. 1913 Mich; Esther A. b. 1918 Wisc.
- 1922 – Sept. 18, 1922, Herman Teppo of Tripp, died at Wales, Wisconsin, sanitarium. Iron River Pioneer, Bayfield Co., 1918–1924 compiled by the Wisc. State Historical Society, Madison, WI.; died of miner’s lung disease at Wisconsin Tuberculosis Sanitarium.

### **Maria Amanda Kangas Genealogical Notes**

- 1893, Canadian Passenger Lists, 1865–1935 has an Amanda Kangas, age 16, b. abt. 1877, arrival 9 Jul 1893 aboard the Sardinian from Liverpool to Quebec, Roll C–4539.

- When Bessie´s sister MARIA AMANDA was christened were as godfather and – mother farmer Erik Makkonen Vanhatalo and wife Kaisa.<sup>97</sup> [23 Dec 2004]
- 1900 Fed. Census, Montana, Belt Twp., Mary Kangas (indexed as Kungas), b. June 1899, age 11 months, b. Montana; mother was Manta (Amanda) Kangas, servant, b. Feb. 1877 in Finland, age 28, emigrated in 1892, housekeeper in the Andrew Matson household consisting of Andrew, 28, Matthew 30 and Alfred Matson age 25, all born in Finland, all bakers. They were indexed as Watson.
- 1901 – Marriage record, 28 Jan 1901, Wakefield, Mich. for Herman Teppo (indexed Tippo), age 21 (1880), of Wakefield, Mich. and Amanda Kangas, 22 (1879) of Wakefield, Mich, both born in Finland, his father, Andrew Teppo & Emelia, his occupation listed as a miner; she listed her parents as Mat Kangas and mother unknown???. witnesses Jakob Parka and Katie Holmes; license date 22 Jan 1901
- 1910 Federal Census, Michigan, Gogebic, Wakefield lists Amanda, wife of Herman Teppo, age 31 (1879), married 10 years, emigration date unreadable, 5 children/4 living; Celia, 9, b. Montana, George 8; Jane 4; Charles 2; and 5 boarders from Finland, iron mine miners. [Indexed at Ancestry as Amanda Leppo and Lourman]
- 1920 Federal Census lists Amanda as Herman Teppo’s wife, age 41 (1879) who emigrated to America in 1895.
